WIZZAIR have unfortunately postponed the introduction of our second based aircraft until the start of the next winter season which starts on 30th October. Flights to Bourgas, Heraklion, Kosice, Lublin, & Riga, Fuertventura & Gran Canaria will not operate this summer.

One flight a week to Dalaman & Faro will commence in July. Flights to other destinations Lanzarote (only to 2nd July, restarts on 6th October), Larnaca, Malaga, Palma, Poznan, Tenerife, Bucharest, Cluj, Gdansk, Katowice, Krakow, Vilnius, Warsaw, & Wroclaw are all operating although there were several frequency reductions during MAY. It has been suggested that the cause of this is due to not being able recruit cabin crew.

Apparently airlines and airports in the UK & Europe are all experiencing staffing problems for crew, cleaners, security, catering etc. This is after the two years of lockdown and now the unprecedented level of pent up demand to get away on holiday or visit relatives.

TUI's inaugural flight to Cancun, Mexico took off from Doncaster Sheffield Airport (DSA) on Monday 2nd May. The new route represents a major commitment to Doncaster Sheffield Airport by TUI, the UK's largest holiday operator. It's TUI's second long-haul destination flying from DSA in addition to the weekly Melbourne Orlando flight serving Florida, on the state-of-the-art 787 Dreamliner aircraft.

Finally, there is nothing further to report about new routes or airlines.





Jubilee Walkway



The Parish Council has been working to improve the walkway which runs alongside the railway line between Mattersey Road and Station Road. The aim is to make it more pleasant for everyone in the village and improve it to mark Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee.

The ground has been cleared of scrub and dead and diseased trees. It will be mowed


periodically to reduce the number of perennial weeds like nettles. 15 trees have been planted to compliment the trees already there, many of which are large native trees with some cherry and mountain ash. The new trees have been chosen to be smaller and compact with flowers providing nectar for pollinators and later in the season fruits for wildlife. All of that in addition to looking good too.

There are winter flowering cherry which from November into April flower profusely. Also, the famed Japanese great white cherry, the Himalayan bronze barked cherry planted 3 together to show off their burnished bronze trunks. which become more apparent as the mature. Finally, there are 5 plum-leaved hawthorn which have white flowers, red berries and wonderful autumn colour. One of these trees has been kindly gifted by the Women's Institute. The Parish Council aims to add a few additional trees in the autumn planting season where space permits.

We hope everyone enjoys the improvements and watching the new trees through the seasons and as they mature. Also, look out for the new fencing which is to be installed at the Mattersey Road end in the coming months.



Christian Perspective

In these days, as we move on from the Covid pandemic and start to learn to live with this virus, I'm continuing to consider how we can press on in our faith. We may have become weary in the season that is passed, with the difficulties of meeting together for such a long time. Now here's my fourth encouragement to pressing on in faith. This one I call 'From Glory to Glory'.



This is taken from 2 Corinthians 3:13-16. Paul has been comparing the Old Covenant with the New, and reminding them how Moses used to have to cover his face when he came out of the presence, the glory, of the Lord, because his face shone so brightly the people couldn't stand it. But then Paul says, the New Covenant is far better and therefore comes with far greater glory. But he says, the Jews didn't get it; it's like they still had a veil between them and the understanding of the truth in Christ.

Then he writes in verse 16: But whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. This is the key to seeing through to the truth-turning to Christ. I love the fact that it says 'whenever'. There is no time limit; this is something that is always open to us at any time. Then comes the word 'anyone'. You don't have to be a special kind of person to turn to the Lord—anyone is welcome when we come to God through Jesus Christ and his death and resurrection.

And once that veil is taken away, as we turn to Jesus in repentance and faith, this is what we discover in verse18: And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit. There's a transformation that takes place as we turn to him, seek him, read the Bible, spend time in prayer. We find we are changed by beholding him.

I remember many years ago at a Christian conference hearing a series of talks by Mike Bickle on this passage in 2 Corinthians 3. For me, it was often the worship songs that stirred up my spirit, but here it was the talks that moved me. When he started to speak from this passage, there was such excitement inside me, to hear how we could behold, contemplate the glory of the Lord and reflect it and become like him-how wonderful, how precious, how amazing that is and should still stir our spirits! 'From glory to glory!'



Look up into his face often; spend time contemplating his love and beauty, his wonderful goodness and faithfulness. There's nothing like it and we are changed by it. This is what we are pressing on towards. There is nothing any better, anywhere than 'seeing' Him and being like him and looking forward to spending eternity in his presence


Puzzle for June

Sudoku is a number placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to complete the grid by entering numbers from 1 to 9 in each empty cell of the 9×9 grid which comprises 9 sub-grids each with 9 cells in a 3×3 pattern. Each row, column and subgrid must contain only one instance of each number.



Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust North Nottinghamshire Local Group



Did you know that more than half the UK's species are in decline? That's what a recent communication from the Notts Wildlife Trust says. And, a quarter of our native mammals are at risk of extinction. That includes our favourite, the hedgehog. Seventy of our birds are on the Red List according to the RSPB. These are not just the rarities; some of them are our most familiar and well-loved birds: summer migrants like swifts, swallows, cuckoos and turtledoves. Then there is the puffin. And green finches, set to disappear. When did you last see a greenfinch? No, I can't remember when I last saw one either!

We mustn't let it slip away, unnoticed till it's too late.


