



North Notts Local Group

With the summer weather prompting us to get outdoors and enjoy some fresh air and sunshine, the North Notts local group has a programme of outdoor activities and walks in mind.

The first one is a guided walk in the Daneshill Lakes Reserve. This is a lovely reserve, managed by Notts Wildlife Trust. It has a wide range of habitats and lots of wildlife to be seen including many wildflowers and an impressive list of birds. The reserve also has an interesting history, having been the site of a royal ordnance factory, built during the war to manufacture explosives and ammunition and, at one time, employing 2,000 people.

The walk will be led by Brian Horne who volunteers on the reserve and is very

knowledgeable about its history and wildlife. Numbers will necessarily be limited so, if you want to go, it's important to book your place. You can do this via the contact details below. The first walk will be on Sunday 3 July from 2 – 4.00pm.

Other dates are not yet fixed so please get in touch if you're interested as extra walks may be arranged. There is also the possibility of cups of tea and cake by the lake at the end of the walk. Perfect for a summer afternoon!

Christian Perspective



Recently we have been thinking about how we can press forward in our faith in difficult times. We started by looking at what Paul wrote in Philippians 3:12-14. We read that after all he had achieved, he was still straining to press on in the faith. He didn't feel that he had yet arrived at full maturity, but needed to keep on going forward, pressing in to the things of Christ.

Now we are going to see something that Peter wrote, giving us our final approach to going on in faith in the troubled times in which we live. His focus is about the forming of Christian character. He starts out in 2 Peter 1:3 by telling us God's part in the process: 'His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature.' He is saying here God's power and heavenly nature are made available to us in Christ. He's not expecting us to somehow create godliness in ourselves.

However, it does demand our cooperation and participation. So what are we to do, what is our part? Peter goes on to explain from verse 6 that it is something that requires effort: 'make every effort to add to your faith'.

Then follows a list of qualities of character we are meant to add to our faith, one on top of another: goodness, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, brotherly affection, love. We are meant to have these qualities in 'increasing measure', and the outcome will be that we are effective and productive in our knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. That is the whole point of our faith in Jesus.

It reminds me of the parable Jesus told about the wise man and foolish man, one building on the rock and one on the sand: whether we look a the wise or the foolish man, there was a storm coming which they would both have to face. We too must face storms in this life and if we build on the firm foundations of the person and teaching of Jesus Christ, we will come through those storms still standing firm in our faith.



Finally, Peter tells us, in verses 10 and 11, the ultimate outcome of living like this will mean: 'you will never stumble, and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.' God bless and keep you as you keep walking with him.

Chair's Annual Report May 2021-2022

This year, almost half of our meetings were suspended due to the continued Covid-19 pandemic and business responsibilities were turned over to our Clerk. Our face-to-face meetings resumed this past September at Lound Village Hall. We were pleased to host a Remembrance event in November to honour the residents who fought in WWII and to unveil our new WWII memorial stone.

We have continued to invest in the playpark by installing a shipping container for storage purposes and have brought electricity to the park for use during festivals. Two councillors attended training on the proper use of weed control, and they will also attend another training course to properly spray weeds using a backpack sprayer. We are also planning on planting trees along the Great North Road (a joint project with Ranskill Parish Council) and around the northern boundary of the play park. We have secured funding for a bench at the south-eastern bus stop, and a glazed shelter will soon replace the brick bus shelter which blew down during a severe storm.

The main topics that occupied the Parish Council this past year include the overdevelopment of Torworth, the small change to the boundary line between Torworth and Ranskill, speeding vehicles and the increase in accidents, and the lack of communication from Bassetlaw District Council regarding enforcement and formal complaints.

Looking forward, we will be hosting the Lighting of the Beacon event on Thursday, June 2nd, and are also supporting the celebrations and street party planned for Sunday, June 5th all as part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee national celebrations. We will continue to work with both county and district councillors in securing funding for further play equipment and to reduce speed limits on our rural roads.

Annual Report from the Playing Field Committee:

After almost two years of lockdown, the Playing Field Committee is pleased to be a part of Torworth's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations in June! As such, we have purchased three PA systems in order to support the live bands, performers, and dog show judges. This is considered an investment as we would have had to rent the equipment for almost the same amount. In effect, should we decide that live performances aren't for future events, then we can sell the equipment to get our money back. We are also supporting the crafting table during the event, as well as selling Jubilee products and a 'guess the name of the bear' in order to raise a little money. However, the enjoyment of the festivities by children and residents alike remains our priority this year.

In the forthcoming months, we are hoping to work with Torworth Parish Council in asking the residents what sort of play equipment they would like to see in the park, as well as applying for funding via the FC Communities foundation grant. We were unsuccessful in last year's round of applications but will revamp our efforts and try again this year.

03/0522: CHAIR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2022

It has been an increasingly busy 12 months as we've come out of Covid restrictions and returned to face-to-face meetings.

The Neighbourhood Plan has continued to take up a considerable amount of time but following the final public consultation, the Regulation 14 process has been successfully completed and the final draft plan is almost ready to be submitted to Bassetlaw for approval prior to the village referendum on its adoption.

There has been a great deal of work put in by the subcommittee to re-invent the parish website and we're almost ready to appoint a contractor to build the new website. My thanks to Councillors Garnet, Janson-Piers and Peel for their time and effort. The Parish Council also finally has its own Facebook page, thanks again to Cllr Janson-Piers for setting that up.

Another project that has finally started to come to fruition is the clearance and replanting of the pathway between Mattersey Road and Station Road. A great deal of positive feedback has been received from parishioners and this work will continue into next year with the final tree planting this autumn followed by smaller planting and wildflowers in spring 2023. My thanks to Councillor Shaw for coordinating the work so far.

Planning for the upcoming Jubilee has also been a focus with the Parish Council agreeing to provide a significant amount of funding towards events. Whilst the festival committee is independent of the Parish Council the work of Councillors Price and Peel, along with other volunteers, to bring the plans to reality is greatly appreciated.

The cataloguing and registration of council owned land has progressed substantially in the last 12 months as access to the archives has finally become available. A lot of the initial focus has been on the burial ground as this appears to have been registered incorrectly since it was purchased and we hopefully now have agreement with Torworth Parish Council on the best way forward. There is a great deal of work still to do on the other portions of land

Another joint project with Torworth that will hopefully be completed in the coming year is further tree planting to fill the gaps along the Great North Road between the two villages. Should the applied for grant funding be received this will be coordinated with further planting around Ranskill.

The coming year will also see the launch of a renewal programme for equipment in the play park to supplement the newer items such as the roundabout and play ship. There are also plans underway for new Christmas lights to be purchased and an event around the switch on.

Lastly, I would like to thank all my fellow councillors for their work during the last year, as well as our County and District councillors for their support and advice and look forward to another productive year for the village in 22/23.

04/0522: FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2022

The year to March 2022 saw the Parish Council increasing its total reserves by £11,980 to £64,507.

A breakdown of Parish Council reserves shows that it is made up of: -

Restricted CIL - £15,389 Ringfenced NP - £0 now all spent Ringfenced Defibrillator reserve - £621 General reserve - £48.497

The Parish Council has now received at total of £40,985 of CIL money over the last 5 years. These funds are restricted in terms of what they can be spent on, mainly capital works, but the intention is to continue to spend some of the money on upgrading the play equipment in the Park. Grant funding will be sought and old play equipment is planned to be replaced in a major refurbishment project. New safety matting was also installed during the year. Further CIL funding from new housing developments in the village is expected later in the financial year.

In addition, CIL funds of about £2,500 have been spent on clearing the land along the Station Road/Mattersey Road path, now renamed The Jubilee Pathway and planting 15 saplings. A grant has been applied for and if successful in the next planting year more trees will be bought to finish this project and any remainder planted in areas around the village greens.

There may also be a need in the coming year to provide some additional finance from general reserves to complete the neighbourhood plan through to referendum. Also commitments from general reserves are planned in the current year to support the village jubilee festival, increased contribution to The Star, The Bowls Club clubhouse repairs and a new parish web site.

Following all planned expenditure reserves will remain at a strong level.

The Chair reported that the NP was almost ready to submit to BDC prior to independent examination. The final draft is being proof read, it is anticipated that the whole process will be completed this year.

b) County Councillor

After the elections in May last year, the new administration at County Hall started work in several key areas:

- * Shaping a new Council Plan for the 10 years 2021-31, with a rolling 4 year focus. This was done through questionnaires and consultation events with residents, District & Borough partners, and wider stakeholder groups, and is available to view on the Council's website.
- * Making an outline bid to Govt for a regional Devolution deal to pass more powers and decision making to local Govt. This preliminary bid was successful and Govt has approved Notts and neighbouring Derbyshire amongst the "pathfinder bids", subject only to submission of a detailed bid. This is currently being progressed, with a decision on the shape and scope expected this autumn/winter.

- * Backing the (successful) bid for the country's only inland Freeport near East Midlands airport.
- * Creating a Development Corporation to support the economic ambitions of the County, including under a Devolution deal. (now established).
- * Backing the bid to build the first STEP nuclear fusion reactor at West Burton (one of 5 preferred sites; decision expected this year).
- * Managing ongoing COVID community support (with District, Borough and community partners).
- * Co-ordinating the Countywide responsibilities for the Homes for Ukraine scheme.
- * Major reviews of:
- highways maintenance with new practice and process being implemented
- electric vehicle charging infrastructure review ongoing
- household waste recycling centres (waste collection & disposal) review ongoing

The Council AGM takes place Thursday 12 May, after which we will operate under a new Cabinet structure, intended to improve the speed and efficiency of decision making ahead of implementing the future Devolution deal.
