

Christian Perspective

I don't know what it's like in your house, but in ours you can't go to bed until you've watched the 10 o'clock news and weather forecast. Sometimes the items the editors choose to present surprise me. Recently they had been doing a survey among some people asking how they felt in the current times of inflation and such problems. Apparently something like 80% where more worried now than they were before. I wondered why they bothered to bring such an item and what they intended to bring to us by it. Did they think, I wondered, that it would help more of us feel more worried?

I was immediately reminded of some words of Jesus that we find in Matthews Gospel chapter 6. We read this in verse 24: Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food and the body more important than clothes?

He speaks about the birds who don't worry about planting seed and harvesting and storing crops, but are fed by our heavenly father (v26). Then he says an



interestina thing about worry, "Who by worrying can add a single hour to his life?" I found some inform-

ation on the internet on anxiety (worry), which said that excessive anxiety can have a devastating effect on our physical and mental health.

It went on to say that symptoms can include depression, headaches, heart and breathing problems, upset stomach, fatigue, increase in blood pressure

and pains in our muscles. What a list! So Jesus is quite right when he says we can't add an hour to our lives by worrying. In fact it is more likely to shorten them, as well as reducing the quality of life we can enjoy.

He goes on to speak about the wild flowers and says they don't work and worry, but God makes them beautiful, more splendid than the best-dressed royals.

I also discovered on the internet that people try all sorts of ways to deal with the worry in their lives-comfort eating, thinking positive



thoughts, various medications etc. So what does Jesus say is the way to combat worry? He says in verse 32, that it is unbelievers who worry about these things, but for us who believe in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour, we can trust our Heavenly Father to know what we need and to provide for us as we trust in him. So, Jesus tells us the best way to deal with the potential for worry is to, "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well." v33.

So, for the Christian it's about faith and focus. We focus on putting our energies into serving God, and then trust him to provide. If you have never begun to trust in Jesus as your Saviour, today is a good day to


Puzzle for August

Here at the RSPCA Doncaster and Rotherham Branch, we care for over 1000 animals per year ranging from dogs, cats, puppies and kittens to birds, wildlife and rabbits. We aim to rescue, rehabilitate and rehome every animal that we care for.

Below you will find our current long stays residents, all of whom are ready and waiting for their forever families.

Mable and Maple are our current longest stay residents. They are a pair of young sister rabbits who have been in our care for over 7 months, after being found stray at a young age. They have spent the vast majority of their life with us and sadly have never experienced a loving family home. Like most other rabbits, they love their fresh vegetables

and will make a great addition to any home. As they are bonded to one another they will need to find a home that is happy to accept both of them.

Our longest stay feline residents are Elijah and Erica, this bonded pair started their cattery journey being quite timid, but since settling in and making friends with staff, they are now a super affectionate pair and love having fusses. Since they have been in our care, they are starting to show more of their true selves. They are looking for the perfect home where they can grow their personalities even more. Elijah and Erica would be best suited to a family with no other pets and children over the age of 12.

Stella is our longest stay canine. She's only 11 months old and has been with us for almost 4 months now. Stella's a sweet girl and could live with children over 12 years old. She would need to be the only dog in the household for now. Due to a leg injury early on in life,

Stella requires physiotherapy treatment and would need a family who understands she may need additional care in the future.

Whether you are on the lookout for a dynamic duo or a sole companion, we have a wide variety of animals currently available for adoption – from dogs and cats to rabbits and quinea pigs.



POTATO WEDGES with CHEESE & ONION



1 red pepper, sliced thin

Bunch spring onions, diced

4oz water-thin ham, diced

Season to taste and turn into a casserole dish

Sprinkle over 1 tsp paprika and grill for a few minutes to brown

Spread over a small carton of crème fraiche

Sprinkle 4oz grated cheese on top and grill again to melt and brown

Bake for 10-15 mins till cream and cheese melt to make a sauce

August is a great month for wildlife spotting and we in Bassetlaw are very fortunate in that we live so close to the Idle Valley Nature Reserve.

It's the largest nature reserve in the East Midlands so no shortage of nature to be spotted there! Bellmoor Lake, in front of the Rural Learning Centre is home to vast numbers of water birds, including mute swans and a variety of gulls. There's always something unexpected too for those sharp-eyed people who remember to bring their binoculars.

We know that a connection with nature is good for our mental health and wellbeing and if it's good for us, it's will be good for nature too if it means we respect it and care, not only about it but for it. It's worth spending a little time thinking about our connection and cultivating it. Don't just spot the different types of bird, tick them off on your list and leave. That's contact, not connection. Connection goes deeper.

Stop for a few moments. Really look at what those birds are doing. Listen to their calls. Think about why they're important to you; how watching



them carefully makes you feel. Do it every day and you will notice a difference in yourself; it doesn't have to be birds. There are plenty of flowers, trees, grasses, insects. I could go on indefinitely. Just do it with whatever takes your fancy and start changing your life.
