Childhood Memories - Part 1

One day, for no apparent reason, I got to wondering how many people were left in Ranskill who were either born here or who had lived the majority of their lives here. When I got to 20 odd I started to struggle. I then thought, as I was born in 1938, that if anyone, especially my grandchildren, were interested in Ranskill in the 1940s I had better do something about it and jot a few things down.

My earliest memories are of the war years, spending nights in the air raid shelter my grandfather had built in the garden whilst Sheffield was being bombed. It was dark and damp with a musty smell and sometimes heated by a paraffin stove. I did not realise at the time but my father, who was in the RASC at that time, was driving an army ambulance in Sheffield throughout the blitz. I also remember the blackout. we had shutters for some windows but others had to be blocked up before we put the lights on. My grandfather had a 1934 Austin 10 and black tin boxes with slits were fitted over the headlights, how anybody could see to drive in the dark I

do not know. Everyone had rations books and I used to try and make my monthly ration of sweets last until the next month.

When I was five I started school at Torworth, travelling there on a seat on the back of my mother's bike. On the first morning I screamed the place down, a feeling that was to last for the next ten years.

In the bad winter of 1947 the snow drifted on the path between Ranskill and Torworth to a depth of 2-3 feet. Mr Duckmanton, the local road man, cut a path through them and I can remember walking in single file to school behind Miss Ash the infant teacher. Miss Ash was a fine figure of a woman and her star jumps in

PT were quite memorable. At that time every child at school was issued with a red gas mask.

My grandfather had a garage on what is now part of the Blue Bell car park and I used to potter about in there. I can also remember the arrival of the first electric petrol pump. If the power failed, which was not unusual, you had to bolt a handle onto a pulley and turn it but it was not easy. On a Sunday morning some of the senior citizens would gather to discuss the previous week's events and I would be loitering in the background trying not to miss anything. Grandad kept the takings in a tea caddy on the office table.

Christian Perspective



I'm wondering as I look around at all that is going on these days—how high are our expectations? Do we expect to always experience a higher and higher standard of living? Do we look at others who seem

to have it all and feel envious and think life is unfair? We are told 'everybody is struggling' and therefore it is assumed, life is bad. Is this the attitude that believers in Jesus Christ should take?

I was struck recently by words of the Apostle Paul writing to the church in Philippi. He writes. I have learnt to be content whatever the circumstances. Phil 4:11. So he has learnt—there is a learning process, and it's not something that comes easily and naturally. But rather it comes through experiencing the highs and lows of life. Paul says he is rejoicing because they have sent him a gift which makes his life easier and blesses him because they have remembered him, but he is content anyway, with or without the gift.

We may be right now, in a situation of difficulty. Paul knows all about this. He says: I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. v12.

Paul has been there, he has endured and enjoyed both the need and the plenty. And, just as there is a learning process, so there is also a 'secret' to arriving at this attitude of being content.

We can see something of the secret in the words he uses at the end of this passage: I can do all things through Him who gives me strength. v13. It's about having faith in Jesus to meet our needs as we focus on serving him and trusting him in all circumstances. Because Paul is trusting in Jesus Christ, serving him and about his business, he knows that God will take care of him and teach him inner contentment and security whatever is happening the world around him.

Paul is on the same subject when he writes to Timothy: But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. 1 Tim 6:6. He goes on to say that our attitude to money matters. Those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge

It's important where we place our focus. If we make it our aim to please God and use the gifts he has given us for his kingdom, then we can be sure he will provide for us in every way. He loves us and knows every detail about us. He doesn't always give us everything we might want, but certainly what we need.


Puzzle for September

Sudoku is a number placement puzzle. The aim of Sudoku is to complete the grid by entering numbers from 1 to 9 in each empty cell of the 9×9 grid which comprises 9 sub-grids each with 9 cells in a 3×3 pattern. Each row, column and subgrid must contain only one instance of each number.

"A Year at Rutland Water"

You may already know Tim. He was a familiar face in the Idle Valley Centre when he worked there for Notts Wildlife Trust. Then came his move to Rutland Water where he is now the Species and Recording Officer. Tim clearly enjoys his role at this beautiful reserve and is keen to share his enjoyment and experiences of it. He says, "Rutland Water is perhaps best known for its bird life. With over 20,000 waterfowl visiting the site in the winter, it is an internationally important wetland. Coupled with the success of the Osprey and Water Vole reintroduction projects, the reserve has gone from strength to strength in the 45 years of its existence. I will cover a year at Rutland Water, and show you that there is more to Rutland than just birds."

Brownie and Rainbow meetings begin on 11th and 12th September respectively.



The sessions will be strictly limited to 10 attendees and will be subject to a suggested donation of £5 per person, per session. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.







TOMATO QUICHE

Line a 10" flan tin with pastry and bake blind for 25 mins at 400°F

1oz butter1 medium onion, finely chopped2oz fresh breadcrumbs2 eggs, beaten2 tablsp milk1lb skinned tomatoes

4oz grated cheese 1 level teasp mixed herbs Pepper

1/2 level teasp each garlic salt and dry mustard

Saute onion in butter till transparent

Take off heat and combine with breadcrumbs, cheese and seasonings Beat eggs and milk together and add then spread over base of flan Slice tomatoes – scatter "end" bits over flan and arrange slices, neatly overlapping

Sprinkle with pepper and bake fur a further 20 mins

Brush with a little extra butter and cool

NIPPY BEETROOTS - serves 4

Cook, drain and dice 2-3 beetroots, 4 if smallish (to equal 2 cupsful)

In a saucepan:

3 tablsp or 1 generous oz of butter 1 tablsp honey Pinch of salt

2 tablsp prepared mustard 1 teasp Worcester sauce

Heat to just boiling then add to beetroots and stir to glaze - serve hot


