

Christian Perspective

It's that busy time of year again. How are your lists going? I know some people don't make lists of things to buy and do leading up to Christmas and others can't cope without them. Being busy seems to be a good thing, and it has always been my purpose, since I retired, to ensure I have at least one purposeful activity every day to make my life feel worthwhile. For each of us there are different things we are uniquely fitted to be doing, things that bring us satisfaction and that God has gifted us for.

Sometimes we think that being fruitful for the Lord is the same as being busy about his work. But just filling our time with activities isn't necessarily God's purpose for us. It has come to me afresh in these times that fruitfulness for the Kingdom starts in abiding in Jesus.

In John's Gospel chapter 15 Jesus speaks about the position of the believer, which is like that of a branch attached to the vine. The only way we can be well attached is by the constant abiding that Jesus is talking about here. In verse



4 we read: Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. When we set out to serve God in our own strength and understanding, it only leads to either burning ourselves out, or if we succeed, then it leads to pride in our own abilities.



But if we draw strength and wisdom from him and allow the presence of the Holy Spirit to live in us through faith in Jesus and serve in the love and power in his Name, then it will be his work that will be done and he will get the glory.

One of the ways this is seen is explained by John in his first letter. He writes this: *But if anyone obeys his word, love for God is truly made complete in them. This is how we know we are in him: Whoever claims to live in him must live as Jesus did. 1 John 2:5, 6.* So we go the Gospels and see how Jesus lived. We ask questions like: Who were the sort of people he associated with? What was his relationship with his heavenly Father like? What did he do before making important decisions, like choosing his 12 disciples?

Why not go to the bible and look up some answers to these questions for yourself and compare the life of Jesus with your life. If you fall short ask him to help you make a fresh start. God bless you as you abide, remain, lean in to Jesus and walk as he walked.





Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust North Notts Local Group Talk—The Missing Lynx!

David says, "Since the last iceage, Britain has lost almost all its large predators. Only the Badger and the Red Fox remain – and they are hardly 'large.' Bears, Wolves and Lynx have all gone. It has been argued that the loss of these 'top predators' has led to a destabilising of our fauna. Is this true? With the current enthusiasm for 'rewilding, what might be the consequences of their reintroduction? What was their role in our ecosystem and what can we learn from reintroduction programs elsewhere in Europe and further afield?"

This promises to be a fascinating talk on a very topical subject. David is an accomplished speaker who has visited us many times before. His talks always contain an element of fun (as in the title!) and we always come away having learnt something very



RECIPES to try ...

SPICEY HONEY GINGERBREAD

8oz plain flour 1¹/₂ teasp ginger (go easy!) Salt (pinch) 2oz granulated sugar 4oz raisins 4oz clear honey 1/2 teasp bicarbonate of soda 2 tablsp milk 1 egg, lightly beaten (if large egg increase milk slightly) To finish - 2 tablsp coarse cut marmalade Sieve flour, salt and ginger into a basin then add sugar and raisins Gently melt butter and honey Dissolve bicarb in the milk and add to honey mix Make a well in the flour and combine all together then turn out into a lined tin, approx 71/2" square Bake at 325°F 190°C Gas Mark 3 for 30 minutes Spread marmalade on cake and bake for further 15-20 minutes

CHEESE CUBES - for cocktails or round the bonfire!

Cut white breads into 1" cubes (no crusts) - dip in beaten egg and milk then roll in finely grated cheese open freeze until needed Bake at 400°F Mark 6 for 15-20 minutes

ONION APPLE FLAN

1/2 lb cooking apples, sliced 1/4 pint milk Salt and pepper

1 onion, chopped 3 tomatoes, sliced 2 eggs 3oz grated cheese

Line a 10" flan tin with shortcrust pastry Simmer apple and onion with a little water till tender – cool then place on pastry Sprinkle on cheese Beat together eggs, milk, salt and pepper then pour on top Bake at 400°C Mark 6 for 10-15 minutes then lower heat to 350° Mark 5 Spread sliced tomatoes on top – bake for a further 20-30 minutes till set Serve hot Freezes well

The Hive Energy pulverised ash project at Idle Valley the applicant is progressing further assessment work and revising working and restoration plans. When available there will be a further public consultation.

The VIA EM consultation for lower speed limits between Ranskill and through Torworth has obtained the opinion of statutory consultees.

FCC Environment at Daneshill have submitted an appeal against the Environmental Agency's refusal of a permit for sorting asbestos contaminated soil.

There are no schools in Bassetlaw with an aerated concrete (RAAC) issue.
