Christian Perspective



Most of us know the Lord's Prayer and the line that says, "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us." I've been thinking about receiving forgiveness and releasing forgiveness to others, and how we deal

with people who hurt and misuse us. When we are determined to hold on to the hurt we feel we can experience anger and unhappiness. We can choose to hold on to hurts inflicted by others but this leads to bitterness within, and can cause all sorts of emotional and physical problems.

At the end of the teaching of Jesus on prayer he says this. *"For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins." Matthew 6:14, 15.* Well, that is food for thought! It seems a scary verse and puts a lot of responsibility on us to live in a forgiving way towards others. We can only forgive others when the love of God is at work in us.

When others have hurt us, we feel we can protect ourselves by hugging unforgiveness to ourselves — well, after all, they don't deserve it do they? And if I forgive them it surely gives them the message they can just do it all over again. But so long as we withhold offering forgiveness we bind ourselves up.

And of course they don't deserve it, but then neither do we deserve God's forgiveness for our innate sinful natures, our disregarding of him as our maker, our spurning of his love, his ways, his purposes, his holiness. And when you see it in that light it takes on a whole new perspective.

Not everyone we forgive will respond in a godly way. There are times when we need to remove ourselves from a damaging situation. It may not always be appropriate to openly speak out forgiveness especially if the person is unrepentant or may have already died. When a person refuses to repent, there is only so far you can go in bringing about reconciliation. But when we forgive them before God we free our own hearts from the effects of their actions.

We can feel that in a certain way withholding forgiveness punishes them, but God says, V*engeance in mine, I will repay.* So when we forgive we deliver them into God's hands to do with as he wills.

Our forgiveness towards others is meant to reflect the Lord's forgiveness to us. So, when we release forgiveness it changes things. It releases us from the oppression of the hurt, bringing freedom, healing and

blessing. It releases them into God's hands for him to deal with them as he sees fit in his omniscience. It opens us up to receive God's forgiveness and it gives open access for God to hear and respond to our prayers.



God bless you as

you work this through in your own lives with the help of God's grace.

Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust North Notts Local Group: Nature Walk

One of the Local Group members, Gary Hobson, leads a free, monthly nature walk, usually round some part of the Idle Valley Nature Reserve. His April walk began at Chainbridge Lane and made a circle round via Tiln North looking for passage waders and early summer migrants. The weather was cold but there was a good turnout; as Gary's unerring ability to find birds is becoming better known!

Lots of birds were seen, highlights being Red-crested Pochard, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Green Sandpipers, White Wagtails and our first Swift of the year. Plenty of summer migrants including Willow Warbler, Reed Warbler, Cetti's Warbler, Sedge Warbler, plus Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Chiffchaff and Blackcap. Everyone enjoyed sorting out the bird songs.

Gary said, "I'm sure everyone enjoyed the walk and saw new birds. These walks are aimed at birdwatching and wildlife spotting with a leisurely feel, and within the range of most abilities. The Idle Valley is a wonderful site, very mixed in habitat types, and there are more areas to explore. Every day is different, and each season has different birds. One lady remarked that she had never seen so many birds in a day. Collectively, we saw or heard 58 species."



RECIPES to try ...

ITALIAN BREAD PUDDING (serves 4)

2 small eating apples 2 eggs 4-6 slices white bread

2 tablsp white wine 2 level tablsp sugar Thinly pared rind of 1 o 300 mls (large carton) single cream 1oz butter for greasing dish

Thinly pared rind of 1 orange

Cover with bread pieces, crusts removed, press gently

Combine cream, eggs, remaining sugar and orange rind then pour over and press gently Let stand for 30 mins to soak in

Bake around 30 mins at 350°F 180°C Gas Mark 4 till golden and set (Test apples with a skewer for being soft)

Let stand a little and serve warm

CHEESECAKE BROWNIES (makes 24 squares)

8oz softened butter3oz cocoa powder11oz caster sugar1 tablsp milk4oz SR flour plus extra level tablsp for topping

6 eggs 3oz full fat cream cheese 1 teasp vanilla essence

Line a 13 x 9" tin with baking paper

Whisk butter, cocoa, 5 eggs, $10\frac{1}{2}$ of the sugar, milk and flour to a smooth batter Spoon into tin but reserving 4 tablespoons

Combine cream cheese, remaining sugar, 1 egg and vanilla + the extra tablespoon of flour Beat smooth and pour over the brownie batter in tin

Drop spoonsful of reserved batter on top and swirl with tip of a knife to create marbled effect

Bake at 350°F 180°C Gas Mark 4 for 30-35 mins till springy to touch - cool completely before cutting

Can make cupcakes, reducing baking time to 20 mins

Chair's Report May 2023-2024

This past year has been relatively quiet in the Parish although we've received some complex planning applications such the ones from the HIVE and the FCC, but relatively few domestic applications. The PC was successful in having the speed in the village reduced to 30mph which will be a huge improvement to our residents when they pull out onto the main road and to our students when they get on/off the school bus.

The Parish Council has continued to invest in the playing field: we have been replacing the old chain-link fence and straightening our boundary lines. We have pruned many of our existing trees and have planted three new varieties of trees and shrubs along the back fence. We will also be developing two corners of the park into peaceful areas filled with flowers and maybe a few more benches. The local Scouts will be planting bulbs there this coming autumn and we also plan on planting a wildflower meadow for wildlife/insects.

Last May, we hosted the Coronation of King Charles II and had a full evening of activities including a Children's Street Party, a vintage solo singer, a band, fire dancers, stilt walker, giant bubbles and a BBQ tent. The weather was absolutely fantastic enabling people to sit out and enjoy the sun, visit with friends and neighbours while listening to great music. This June, we will be hosting the 80th D-Day commemoration by lighting our beacon to align with the national lighting of the beacons and the recitation of the International Tribute.

We look forward to another year working with our district and county councillors, and of course our lovely residents, as we continue to apply for funding to gain more equipment for the park.

A new expenses policy was presented, based on the NALC LTN 33 note. Cllrs agreed to adopt the policy and further awarded an annual allowance to the Chair to be agreed annually. **Carried.**
