#### **Christian Perspective-Friends**



Some of us find it easier to meet people and make friends than others. If you have good friends you can tell them more about yourself and what goes on in your life. and how you

feel about things, than you might say to others. Having shared interests is a good place to start. Friendship assumes two parts. It needs to be a relationship which works with 'give and take' on both sides.

As much as we need people in our lives, to be our friends, human beings can let us down. They may not be there just when we need them, even talk about us behind our backs. It's good to have people who are our friends, but even better is knowing God as your friend.

When Jesus was talking to his disciples, as we read it in John's Gospel, he had some interesting things to say to them about friendship with him.

You are my friends if you do what I command. It is still a two-way relationship. Friendship with Jesus requires obedience on our part. Last month I wrote about Jesus telling them to love one another as he had loved them. This is his new commandment to them and to us which he calls us to obey.

Jesus continues by saying: I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his

master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. John 15:14-15. Doing this opens the door to a close relationship with him, from servants to friends, ones who he could now talk to in a more intimate way.

We also read about Abraham being called 'a friend of God'. This highlights the second condition of friendship with Almighty God. We find it in James 2:21-23: Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness. And he was called the friend of God. Here we see that believing what God says to us and acting on it counts us as righteous in his sight.

When we believe the truths of the Gospel, that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, came to earth to reveal God to us, died for our sins and rose again, we can enter in to this very precious friendship with him. We can expect to enjoy two-way conversations with him in prayer, to hear him speaking to us through the truths of the Bible, to know the comfort

and peace of his presence and to be assured of the way he wants us to go. God bless you as you walk in these things with obedience and faith.

This month's talk, the final one in the series, is by David Parkin, renowned expert on birds and avian genetics and one of our favourite speakers. He will tell us about how Darwin developed his theory of evolution, a theory that explains so much about how we come to have such a diversity of life on earth, and what our place is in the process that created this diversity.

## Recipes to try -

#### Banana Bread with Walnuts

(after Paul Hollywood)

You will need:-

3 large or 4 medium ripe bananas 250g plain flour

250g caster sugar 2tsp baking powder

125g unsalted butter, softened 120g walnut pieces

2 medium eggs

#### Method:-

Heat the oven to 190 degrees C. Line a 1kg loaf tin with baking parchment.

Roughly mash the bananas with the sugar and beat together until fluffy.

Add the butter and beat until evenly combined.

Beat in the eggs, one at a time, adding a spoonful of flour with each.

Then sift the remaining flour and baking powder over the mixture and carefully fold in.

Finally, fold in the walnut pieces.

Spoon the mixture into the prepared loaf tin and spread evenly. Bake for 40 minutes, or until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Remove from the tin and cool on a wire rack.
