Christian Perspective



We were given an amaryllis bulb for Christmas. It was just a bulb in a box, nothing else with it, no compost, no pot. It looked brown and dead. I did nothing with it for a week or two, and then decided I had better find a pot to put it in and some compost for it to grow in. So I obeyed the instructions

without much hope of seeing it grow. I gave it water, warmth and light, and waited quite some time, but nothing seemed to happen. Eventually a tiny green shoot started come up. But there was little more. After a while of it sitting there, I had a bright idea: plant food gives life.

So I went hunting among my gardening things and found some 'Multi-purpose controlled release plant food'. I pushed some granules into the compost and watered it again and left it some more. Eventually a stem began to grow. It grew taller and taller every day, until I wondered if it would fit within the window space. This stem had a flower bud on top

Then as it drew life from the plant food and the sunlight, six flowers open slowly one by one. They were glorious flowers, delicate pink and white. Then as the first ones began to fade and drop a second stem came out of the bulb and began to climb in its turn. This finally produced four more flowers. I had never had such a fruitful amaryllis plant.

I noticed that when it was left unattended, neglected and unfed it appeared to be just a dry bulb, apparently dead! It reminded me about our faith, that for it to grow we need to feed it daily. We need it to be nurtured more deeply with the food of the word of God. It's easy to neglect what we believe, what we once entered into, maybe when we were young and to forget it needs to be regularly fed. The writer to the Hebrews says: how shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation, which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed to us by those who heard him, God also bearing witness both with signs and wonders, with various miracles, and gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to His own will? Hebrews 2:3-4

We need to be ready to hear God speaking to us and for him to be working out his purposes through us. Paul writes, in his letter to the Colossians: Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right

hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Col. 3:1-4



What wonderful promises come with a lively and growing faith. God bless you as you continue in his ways.





The Wednesday Group has been offering informal support for people affected by dementia for well over ten years. The main aim of the group is to ensure that those whose lives are touched by this most awful disease are able to have fun, socialise, enjoy a range of activities and simply be treated as normal, human beings. Sessions usually start with tea, biscuits and an opportunity to talk and catch up with other members. Bingo, a quiz and a chair dance session follow. A two course lunch is served around 1.00pm and for the last hour of the afternoon there is live music and members usually dance or sing along to any of the seven musicians or groups that visit regularly. Once a fortnight, when Frank brings his keyboard, members may play cards, dominoes, chess or do craft work. There's also boccia and various other group games on offer. The traditional hay meadows, bursting with wildflowers, like the Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust's Ashtons Meadow near Treswell are rarities and the loss of these important habitats will, inevitably, have a detrimental effect on the insects that would normally live and feed there and that, in their turn, become food for birds and other animals. Vital work these insects are doing but that's not all; they are responsible for pollinating the flowering plants as they go about their daily foraging. Hopefully the summer will give us the opportunity to learn a little more about the insects that are such a vital part of our life support system on earth and perhaps to be a little more tolerant of them when they buzz around our picnic lunches. Keep an eye open for opportunities to visit places that are rewilding and see if we can learn anything from what they are doing to help us in our efforts to encourage nature back into our own gardens.

The North Nottinghamshire Local Group is still finalising its summer programme but guided walks, visits to places of interest and perhaps some pond dipping are likely and a visit to any place specialising in native wild flowers is a distinct possibility for a visit so watch this space or better still, sign up for my regular emails and make sure you don't miss anything.
